From David's Desk:

If memory serves, about four years ago, I wrote about my grandfather. John J. Campbell, Sr. People called him "John J." I wrote about him close to the first of May, 2006. That would have been his 100th birthday. This week, he would have been 104.

My grandfather lived in the town in which he was raised. For that matter, he lived in the same house. My grandparents moved into a smaller place when I was a child, but I remember it still. In my office, I have a picture of a painting of that house. Not only was my grandfather raised in that community, but so was his father, and his grandfather, and his great-grandfather. As a matter of fact, my great-great-great-great grandfather moved into the little community of Sandtown and joined the Methodist church there.

Some of my earliest memories are of going to that church with my grandparents. I would sit next to my grandfather and listen to him sing out of the Cokesbury hymnal. For years, I would go every year on the third Sunday of May for their Homecoming. My cousin and I would run around the church grounds. We would wander through the cemetery and count the number of "Campbell" headstones. We could trace our family tree back to 1799 with relative ease in one graveyard.

As I think of my grandfather, I think of the family he left. All three of his children have a strong faith and are still active in church today. One of his grandchildren, the one with whom I used to run through the cemetery, grew up and married a preacher. Another of his grandchildren grew up to be a Methodist preacher.

He died more than three decades ago, but I believe with all my heart he would be pleased with this legacy. Of course he worked hard and provided for them. He spoiled his grandchildren and he was blessed with good friends. But I believe that what he would have wanted more than anything were children and grandchildren who loved Jesus. (There are now 10 great grandchildren, none of whom he ever saw, who are all active in church with their parents!) Of all the things by which we can be measured in life... could you really ask for more?

And so, May 1st I think of my grandfather. He was very sick before he died. I would not wish him back like that. But I rejoice knowing that he has received his heavenly body. He has received the reward of his faith. And he has left a family that will one day do the same. I have no doubt he would be pleased.

Guatemala has the highest incidence of poverty in Latin America. 51% of the population lives in poverty (2006 Survey of Living Conditions) with 30% of the population living in extreme poverty. Those in extreme poverty do not have sufficient income to buy a basket of food to ensure the minimum calorie intake required daily. Become a part of the mission team to Guatemala by taking the "one" challenge. 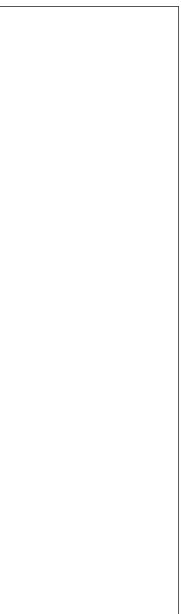
